City Clerk Dye called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

The following Council Members were present: Council Member Yvonne Clayton, Council Member Jesse Kendle, Council Member Joe Woerner, Deputy Mayor Amy Quinn and Mayor John Moor. Also present were: City Attorney Frederick Raffetto, Acting City Manager Tony Nuccio and City Clerk Cindy Dye.

Deputy Chief Salerno explained the Justice Assistance Program (JAG) to the City Council.

3. Items to be presented by **Salvatore Alfieri, Esquire**
 - a. Request for Easement to Encroach onto City Right-of-Way
550 Cookman Avenue

Dante Alfieri, Esquire was present, along with his client, James Watt. Mr. Watt explained that he would like to install a temporary vestibule on the premises. Mr. Watt testified as to the need of this vestibule and indicated that it would encroach approximately two feet into the right-of-way. The Council indicated that they would like to see what the vestibule would actually look like. Mr. Watt indicated that he could provide this material by Wednesday's meeting.

- b. Request for Easement to Encroach onto City Right-of-Way
613 Bangs Avenue

Dante Alfieri, Esquire was present, along with his client, Daniel Weeden. Mr. Weeden explained the easement request stating that the request were for awnings over the door and windows at 613 Bangs. Mr. Weeden explained the use of the awnings. The awnings will encroach over the sidewalks but will be at least 6'10" off the ground.

D. Review of Agenda Items for July 8, 2015 Regular meeting.

Acting City Manager Nuccio reviewed the agenda for the July 8, 2015 and responded to the Council's questions.

E. Matters from City Council

Councilman Kendle stated that the movie night was very successful. The kids really enjoyed it. He also requested that there only be a total of two meetings in August. The past Councils has done this in previous years. It was requested that the City Manager and City Attorney look into this matter and reporting back to the Council as to which meetings to eliminate in August.

Deputy Mayor Quinn discussed that parking issue in the municipal parking lot with the new meter system. The Council discussed a permit system and calendar system.

Mayor Moor stated that he received a notice from the New Jersey Motor Vehicle Commission. The inside office will be closed at the Eatontown location on July 17 and 18. Blitz Second Racing donated \$2,000 to the Recreation Department from an event he held last month. Mayor Moor discussed all the detours in the City and explained that the County is talking about making State Highway 71 into a one lane roadway, each way. He explained the difficulty this would cause the City of Asbury Park. He petitioned everyone to reach out to the State representatives to fight this change. He explained the problems that it would cause for the City, including public safety issues.

Acting City Manager stated that the results of the Annual Best New Jersey Beaches contest have been announced. Asbury Park came in as the 6th best beach in New Jersey and 1st in Monmouth County.
